SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

Route	Action
Skin contact	Wash with soap and water. Remove contaminated clothing. If irritation or a rash develops, get medical advice.
Eye contact	Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. If irritation persists, get medical attention.
Inhalation	Move to fresh air. If symptoms persist, get medical advice.
Ingestion	Do NOT induce vomiting. Rinse mouth with water. Contact the Poisons Information Centre on 13 11 26 or a doctor. Ethanol ingestion by children can cause serious effects.
Most important symptoms	Eye irritation and redness. Skin irritation or allergic skin reaction in sensitised individuals. Drowsiness or dizziness if vapours are inhaled in a poorly ventilated space.
Notes to physician	Treat symptomatically.

SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Property	Detail
Flash point	Approximately 18 - 22 degrees C (closed cup); estimated from the ethanol content, not measured
Suitable extinguishing media	Alcohol-resistant foam, dry chemical powder, carbon dioxide, water spray or fog
Unsuitable media	Full water jet (may spread the fire)
Specific hazards	Highly flammable liquid and vapour. Vapours form explosive mixtures with air (ethanol 3.3 - 19 % v/v) and are heavier than air. Closed containers may rupture when heated.
Protective equipment for fire-fighters	Self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing. Cool exposed containers with water spray.

SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Remove all ignition sources. Ventilate the area. Wear gloves and eye protection for bulk spills. Contain and absorb with sand, earth or vermiculite and place in a labelled container for disposal. Do not allow large quantities to enter drains or waterways. Small consumer-size spills can be wiped up and the area rinsed with water.

SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

Category	Guidance
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Handling	Keep away from heat, sparks and open flames. Do not spray towards the eyes or face. Wash hands after handling bulk quantities. Use in well-ventilated areas.
Storage	Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated place away from direct sunlight, between 5 and 25 degrees C. Keep containers tightly closed and upright. Bulk quantities: store as a Class 3 flammable liquid in accordance with AS 1940.
Shelf life	36 months from date of manufacture when stored as directed

SECTION 10: STABILITY AND REACTIVITY

Stable under recommended storage conditions. Highly flammable. Avoid heat, sparks, open flames, strong oxidising agents and prolonged exposure to light. Hazardous combustion products: carbon monoxide and carbon dioxide.

Acute toxicity	Not classified. Ethanol: oral LD50 (rat) about 7060 mg/kg; dermal LD50 (rabbit) > 15800 mg/kg.
Skin corrosion / irritation	Not classified as a skin irritant; repeated contact may cause dryness.
Serious eye damage / irritation	Causes serious eye irritation (ethanol).
Skin sensitisation	Contains fragrance materials that may cause an allergic skin reaction in sensitised individuals; see Section 3.

Not classified as hazardous to the aquatic environment at the concentrations used. Ethanol is readily biodegradable and has low aquatic toxicity. Some fragrance materials are harmful to aquatic life; avoid release of bulk quantities to drains or waterways.
